big dreams realized, thanks to you!

When we embarked on the Project Humane journey in March of 2012, we had 7 distinct goals for our campus-wide renovation. As of our Grand Opening in October 2014, we had accomplished 6 of the 7 goals and the seventh—our Clinic Expansion—is currently underway.

Project Humane has been an amazing adventure for many reasons. First and foremost, we have experienced an outpouring of support from you, our incredible donors. We have exceeded our original fundraising goal of \$5.0 million. We could not be more grateful for your support! **We can all be very proud of the new reality we have created for the pets we serve, the staff and volunteers who work here, and the beautiful, welcoming and positive place the public now has to adopt and surrender pets.** We have indeed made a more efficient and supportive environment to perform our life-saving work.

Another amazing aspect of Project Humane was how quickly it has all taken place. **In the short span of 23 months, we built 2 brand new buildings, renovated 2, demolished 2 and completely landscaped our 4-acre campus.** Many have been involved in making our vision a reality. Our beautiful and functional buildings were designed by the very able and talented architect, Heather Lewis of Animal Arts, LLC who was a dream to work with on this project. We'd also like to give a major shout out to Klinger Constructors, particularly Project Manager Paula Hayden and Field Manager Jason Tabbert, for keeping the job moving forward—on time, on budget and with the quality of work and attention to detail of which we all dreamed. We are proud of the fact that we were able to keep between 30 – 40 construction and trades workers employed on our project. Heads Up Landscaping's Eddie Padilla donated the landscaping design and sourced the over 800 shrubs and trees that are now beautifying our campus. Our own Facilities Team, led by Vince Mouser, has been essential to the Project's success. They executed the entire renovation of the new La Casa de Los Gatos, supported Klinger in many ways on every building and installed all the landscaping. They are currently undertaking our Clinic Expansion Project, which includes renovations to the Facilities building and Learning Center (where Finance and Human Resources will be moving), making way for the Clinic's additional exam, consultation and treatment rooms. This final phase will take five months and

and, most importantly, they raised life-saving funds for the more than 5,000 homeless pets in Animal Humane's care annually! The 32nd Annual Doggie Dash & Dawdle, held on Sunday, November 2nd at Balloon Fiesta Park, brought more than 3,500 passionate pet lovers and 1,000 canine companions to the field all to make a difference in the lives of homeless cats and dogs in our community.

The competitive, chip timed 5K Dash kicked off the day's excitement at 9 am with dogs and their humans racing for top honors per age group. Awards were also given to top individuals running without a dog. Warming up to walk at 11 am, the crowd of 2-Mile Dawdlers and cooling down Dashers perused the Barketplace packed with 70 pet and lifestyle vendors. They took photos in the Clark's Pet Emporium sponsored photo booth and enjoyed a visual test drive of the newest fleet of cars provided by Leader of the Pack sponsor Garcia Subaru.

When their humans were done spoiling their canine companions at the Barketplace, they treated their furry friends to hours of fun at the Doggie Carnival. More than 2,000 dogs dashed their way to the carnival, and were the day's real winners with games including Bobbing for Cheese and Doggie Cake Walk. Canine creativity really shined with Paw Print Painting and caricature artists captured the true happiness of the day. Best Trick, Best Costume and Pet Look-A-Like contests capped off a fun-filled day with truly wonderful winners in all categories!

Tegan is now a happy and healthy three-month-old ready to celebrate her first Christmas with Jasper. Rebecca has even hung stockings for them both, filled with their favorite toys. The family looks forward to watching Tegan and Jasper grow together. Rebecca said "My hope is that Jasper will be with Tegan the way he was with me while I was pregnant and follow her around and look out for her."

The parents stated that their biggest factor in choosing to adopt from Animal Humane was its environment. "We loved the Cat House. It's so bright and welcoming," commented Rebecca. Some of our most passionate donors are the youth in our community. Students like Lindsay, who has been doing everything she can to help homeless pets for many years. From coordinating bake sales to having her Girl Scout troop sew blankets for foster pets; Lindsay is absolutely committed to helping each and every pet in our care. She's attended our Humane Education programs, and is one of our brightest young animal welfare advocates. We are pleased to introduce you to Lindsay Eckelman:

"I have been involved with Animal Humane since I was 9 months old. I waited in the car with my mom for over 2 hours because Animal Humane was full when we found a stray Rottweiler at Taco Cabana.

I have always loved animals, and my parents talk about Animal Humane constantly. So I asked my mom, and wanted to start helping animals.

I believe that homeless pets deserve a better life than living on a street and off of scraps. In a way, I think of them as humans, but with humbler hearts. I mean, how would you feel if you were starving, hurt and alone?

I have made flyers for my bake sales, to show what they're about. Once, my friend Cynthia and I had a scarce amount of people coming to our bake sale, so we decided to turn it into a bake sale/water balloon fight. Another time, I made puppy mill flyers, which explained why we should end puppy mills. I passed them out at school.

One time, we were driving down Montgomery Boulevard and my mom and I noticed 3 dogs running down the middle of the street. We were able to capture 2 of them and brought them to safety. The third one, luckily, ran home.

When I grow up I want to be a veterinarian, and for a hobby I want to study historical weaponry. In my spare time I play volleyball, and have been playing it for over 3 years. I also paint, do crafts and archery."

Yet, most nonetheless greet us affectionately when we come home.

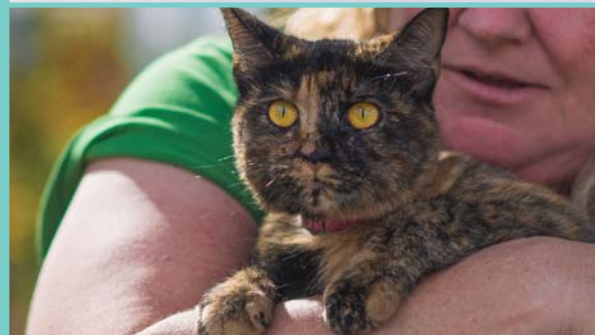
Animal Humane treasures the cats in our care and has the distinct joy of working with several feline friendly businesses in our community, who each support our life-saving work in a different way.

The staff of Klinger Constructors, LLC have always shared their North Valley property with resident felines. Through our partnership and shared commitment to community cats, we were able to help them with trapping and sterilizing each of the cats that has taken up residence on their campus. They've grown quite fond of their kitty tenants and currently share their space with 2 feral cats they've named Kasey and O.C. (other cat).

One of Animal Humane's signature adoptions programs is called Cats Around Town (CAT). Through this program, we have placed adoptable cats in a dozen businesses throughout the Albuquerque metropolitan area. We provide all the housing, bedding, food and litter they need, and each business becomes the adoption agent for their new part time cat-ployees. Jericho Nursery joined us as a CAT partner in October 2013, and has since found loving homes for 25 cats at their location at 6921 Pan American Freeway NE.

They LOVE having adoptable kitties around every day, and their whole team celebrates when they find a home for another Animal Humane feline. Wendy, one of Jericho's passionate staff members, says, "We love being able to find homes for these kitties, and five of our own staff have adopted cats since we've been a CAT location!"

best friends and survivors

The Lucero family came home one day to find that their beloved dog, Lyric, had a mysterious leg injury that was quite severe. They initially took her to a private practice clinic that charged them \$400 to simply clean and splint Lyric's damaged leg. This was an extreme expense for this family, as they were already facing growing medical bills for Lyric's best friend, Kamari—the Lucero's 4-year-old son who was in the midst of 8 cycles of aggressive chemotherapy to treat a cancer that had formed a tumor on his spine.

The Luceros turned to our Donor-subsidized Veterinary Clinic to find a more affordable option to save their dog. The Lucero family never initially mentioned Kamari's illness, nor expected any kind of assistance; they were going to try to make the necessary sacrifices to save their dog. It was important. While in the hospital, Kamari never once cried because he was sick or didn't feel good; he cried because he missed Lyric.

Dr. Rebecca Yarne, one of our skilled Veterinarians said "After working with them and discovering why their son had no hair and what they were going through, we knew they were the perfect candidate to receive support from our Pet Save Fund."

Our Pet Save Fund is a donor supported fund that underwrites the cost of critical veterinary care for owned pets and shelter pets. **Often, pets require extra veterinary care or surgery to relieve suffering and enable them to return to their current homes, or to become ready for a new one.** These services can range upwards from \$200 for critical dental care to \$600 or more for orthopedic surgeries to repair broken limbs or heal other injuries.

Our Veterinary Team amputated Lyric's leg, and provided months of follow up and care to make sure that Kamari's best friend would remain by his side through his extensive treatments. The Lucero family reports that Kamari is officially **CANCER FREE!** Lyric and Kamari are now happy, healed and looking forward to long lives of joy, play and naps together.

"With Kamari battling cancer, another bill wouldn't have fit into our budget, but I was willing to do anything to save Lyric. Animal Humane's Pet Save Fund removed the burden of another bill and allowed us to focus on helping Kamari to get better." – Kimberly Lucero

a 17 year friendship

I started housesitting for Gary Lemkuhl in July of 1996. At that time, he had three cats, Bandit, Midnight and Sunshine, and a Collie named Trixie. Gary loved animals his entire life—particularly dogs. He was the consummate pet parent. No matter the needs or costs—he took care of his four-legged children. And when they passed, he felt their loss deeply.

After Gary retired, he began volunteering at the City of Albuquerque's Westside Shelter. **He volunteered for more than a decade and was responsible for placing 1,000+ dogs in loving homes.** One of these very special adoptions was my own. Gary helped me welcome Dottie Jo into my home six months after the passing of my precious Zoey. Gary consoled me at Zoey's passing—and ultimately, when I was ready, helped me find the perfect addition to my family!

In October 2012, when Gary woke, he could not remember anyone's name. He immediately drove to my home. I asked Gary if he could remember his pet's names and he said, "Yes." So, I told him, "then that's all that matters."

I was with Gary when he was diagnosed with an inoperable brain tumor weeks later. The form of cancer he had was very rare and very aggressive. He was given three months to a year to live.

Following the appointment, we shared lunch across the street. We sat in silence, stunned, until I suggested he get his affairs in order. When he wasn't sure what to do with his life's riches, I said, "This is a no brainer, Gary. Your passion is pets. Follow your heart."

Gary did just that and left a sizeable gift to Animal Humane New Mexico, directing the funds to Project Humane. **His gift contributed to the successful conclusion of their capital campaign and helped them transform their campus to be a true haven for homeless pets.**

On our last day together, I kissed Gary on the forehead and said, "Goodbye." During the 17 years of our friendship I had always said, "See you later." But on this night, a goodbye to a dear friend seemed more fitting. After his death, I served the important role of being his personal representative and delivered his estate gift to 615 Virginia Street SE myself. **As I walk on their campus now, I am reminded of my good friend's passion for pets and know that his legacy will always be alive, saving pets that deserve a second chance.**

Now, her three hour dog walking shifts go by so quickly that sometimes her feet tell her when she's done before she realizes that her shift already ended.

"When you get home, not only are you tired from walking all day, but your appetite is light from all the busy activity and interaction with the dogs," says Irene. She also pointed out that the more weight she loses the more active she wants to be.

Irene says one of the best things about walking dogs is that she is able to enjoy the weather—even in the winter! She's only been rained on twice, and said that she and the dogs enjoyed it very much both times that it happened. This is a great improvement from her many years of observing the weather from an office window.

Irene invites everyone to email our Volunteer Manager and become a dog walker at Animal Humane. We provide training to all of our passionate volunteers, and Irene says "You'll always have a favorite dog you walk and it feels really good to see them adopted into loving homes, especially when you've spent so much time with them."
